### ORDINANCE 4940

# GOSHEN SEWER UTILITY SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES

WHEREAS the rates and charges for services of the Goshen Sewer Utility must produce an income sufficient to maintain the Sewer Utility in a sound physical and financial condition to render adequate and efficient services to its customers.

WHEREAS the rates and charges for services of the Goshen Sewer Utility must be just and equitable.

WHEREAS a financial study of the Goshen Sewer Utility by H.J. Umbaugh & Associates, Certified Public Accountants, LLP, indicates that the certain rates and charges are not sufficient to meet the reasonable financial requirements of the Sewer Utility.

WHEREAS the Common Council finds it necessary to increase certain rates and charges for the services of the Goshen Sewer Utility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Goshen, Indiana, that:

## SECTION 1 TITLE; APPLICATION

- 1.01 This ordinance establishes the schedule of rates and charges for certain services rendered by the Goshen Sewer Utility. This ordinance repeals any provision of a prior ordinance which conflicts with the terms, conditions, rates and charges established by this ordinance.
- 1.02 Terms, conditions, rates and charges of prior ordinances which are not in conflict with this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- 1.03 This ordinance also establishes a schedule of rates and charges for other services of the Goshen Sewer Utility.

## SECTION 2 PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to establish a schedule of rates and charges to be collected by the City of Goshen from the owners of property served by the City's sewer system and users of the waste water disposal system of the City of Goshen. Every person whose premises are served by the City's sewer system shall be charged for the services provided. These charges are established for each user class, as defined in the "Regulations Governing the Services of the Sewer Utility" ordinance, in order that the City's sewer system shall recover from each user and user class revenue which is proportional to its use of the treatment works in terms of volume and load. User charges are levied to defray the cost of operation and maintenance, including replacement, of the treatment works. User charges shall be uniform in magnitude within a user class.

### SECTION 3 SEWER RATES AND CHARGES

### 3.01 Monthly Sewer Rates and Charges

The monthly rates and charges for 2018 shall be effective as of the first billing cycle after the effective date of this ordinance. Each customer shall pay the monthly sewer rates and charges in accordance with the schedules set forth below. The monthly sewer rates and charges shall be adjusted on the first billing cycle of each year following 2018 as provided in Exhibit A attached to this ordinance.

### (A) <u>Metered Customers.</u>

### (1) Monthly Usage Charge

Each metered customer shall pay the following monthly usage charge based on the volume of sewage per one hundred (100) cubic feet discharged: The monthly usage charge will be adjusted each year as provided in Exhibit A attached to this ordinance.

Usage Charge

\$5.63 per 100 Cubic Feet

### (2) Monthly Service Charge

Each metered customer shall pay the monthly service charge beginning on the first billing cycle after the effective date of this ordinance in accordance with the following schedule based on the applicable size of the meter installed. This service charge pays for administrative costs, billing charges, and meter maintenance. This service charge is in addition to the monthly usage charge and will be adjusted each year as provided in Exhibit A attached to this ordinance. If there is a compound meter, only the larger meter will pay a service charge.

- (B) <u>Unmetered Customers.</u>
  - (1) <u>City Water Available</u>

Each customer receiving sewer services for an unmetered residential lot, or unmetered residential building that has city water available shall pay the following monthly usage fee. This usage fee includes the monthly service charge.

(2) <u>City Water Not Available</u>

Each customer receiving sewer services for an unmetered residential lot or unmetered residential building that does not have city water available shall pay the following monthly usage charge. This usage fee includes the monthly service charge.

Usage Charge

The rates for unmetered customers shall be adjusted in the first billing cycle of each subsequent year as provided in Exhibit A attached to this Ordinance.

### SECTION 6 EFFECTIVE DATE

6.01 The provisions set forth in this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and adoption as required by law.
