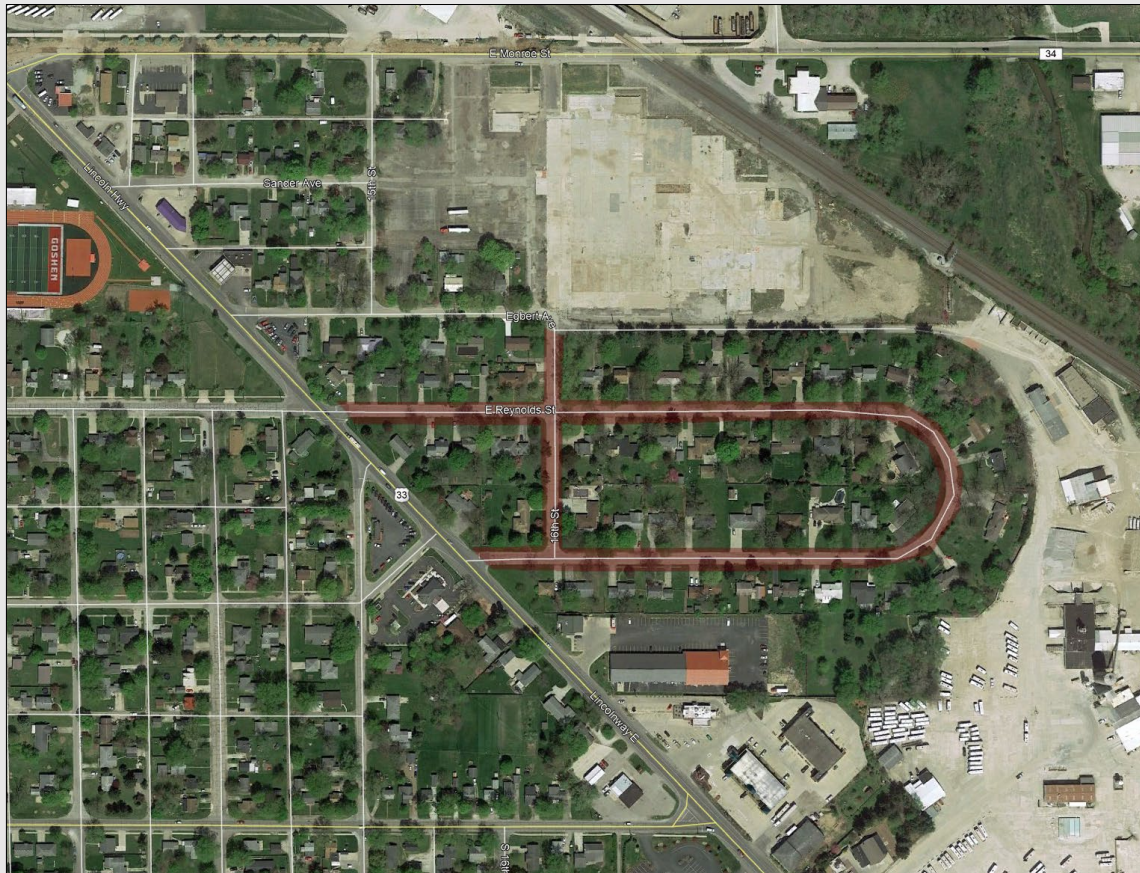

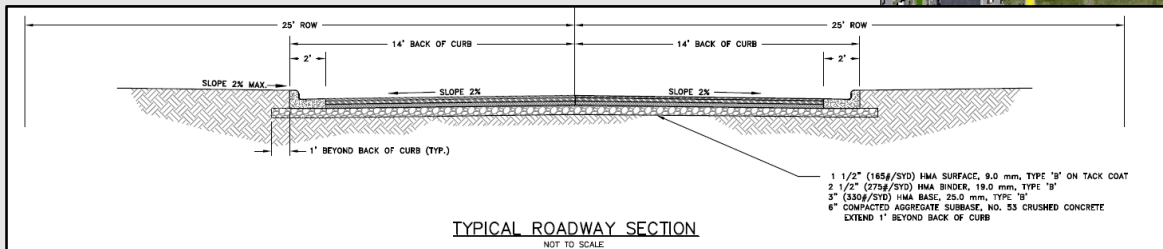
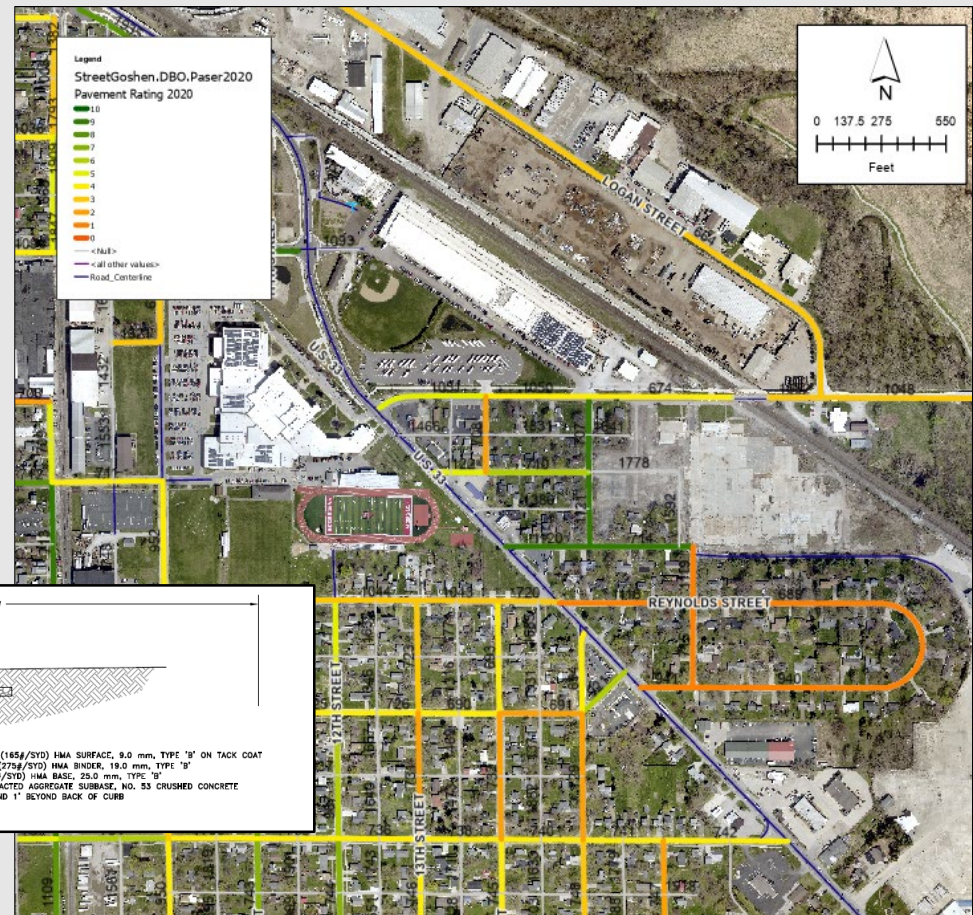

# Project Need and Purpose

- PASER Ratings: Condition of city roads are rated every 2 years on a scale of 1-10
  - 8-10 Good Condition: Routine Maintenance
  - 5-7 Fair Condition: Crack Seal, Seal Coat, Thin Overlay
  - 3-4 Poor Condition: Structural Overlay
  - 1-2 Failed Condition: Reconstruction
- Project Scope: Full Reconstruction



- Contract Bid Amount: \$879,340.85  
Community Crossings Award: \$422,307.92

## Emergency Situations

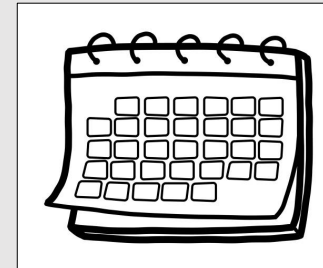
- Contractor will notify door-to-door, if necessary

# Schedule & Access

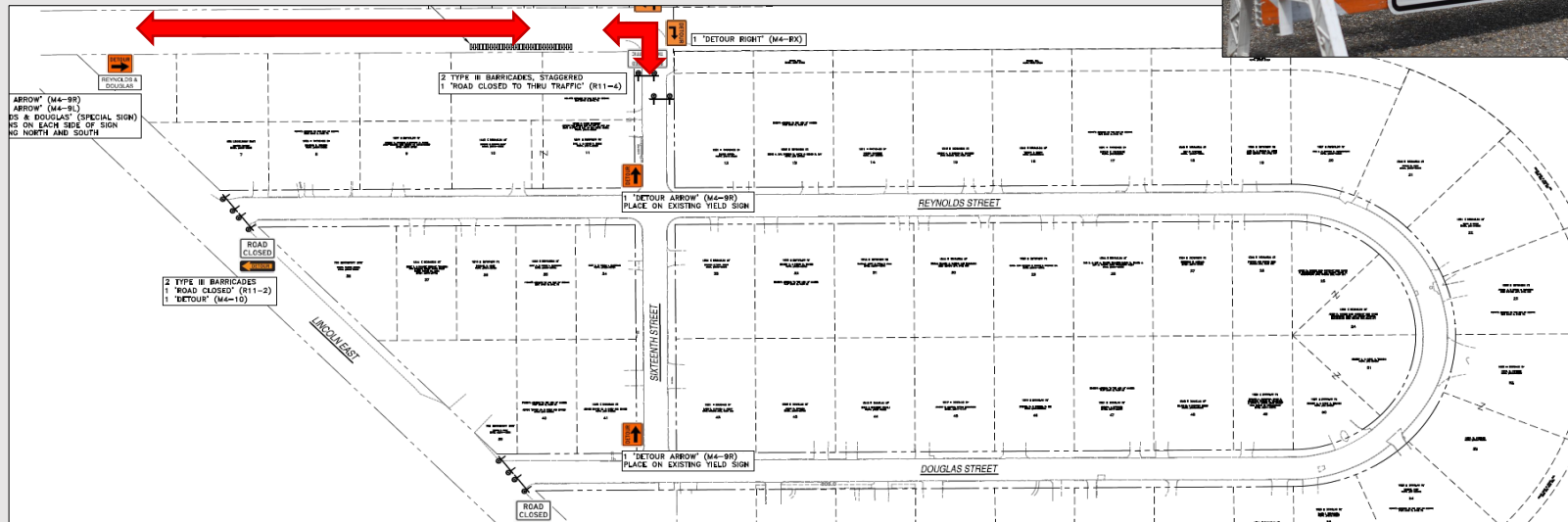
## ○ Schedule

- Preconstruction meeting scheduled for March 8<sup>th</sup>
- Notice To Proceed expected to be issued early- to mid April
- Construction expected to be complete by August 1<sup>st</sup>



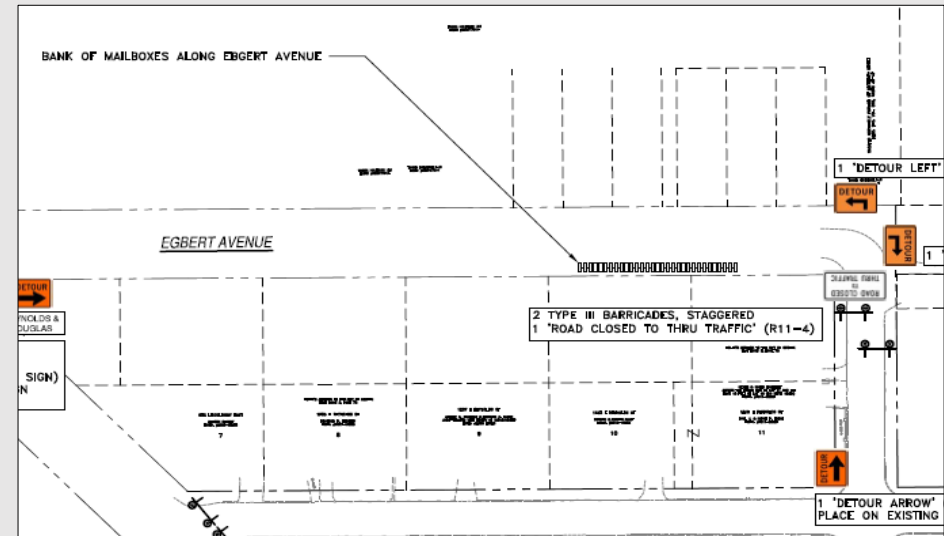
## ○ Access

- Access to residences will be maintained throughout project
- Access will primarily be via Egbert to 16<sup>th</sup> St.
- Reconstruction of drive approaches will likely require 3-4 days of curing – alternative parking can be coordinated



# Services

- Trash – Should be unaffected. If necessary, the contractor will collect it.
- Mail – Can be picked up at a central location likely to be along Egbert
- Utilities – Only water expected to be affected
  - Temporary interruptions with subsequent boil orders
  - Lead and galvanized services encountered will be replaced
- Emergency Services – Access will be maintained for all emergency services
- School Bus Access – Awaiting coordination from school system
- April/May Brush and Leaf Collection – The City will notify residents at a later date, depending on the construction progress, as to if and when the collection will take place
- Special Requirements – If any special circumstances require additional accommodations, please notify Andrew



# Restoration

Disturbed areas will be seeded and watered by the contractor until 70% coverage is reached.

## Items in Right-of-way:

- Mailboxes
  - Will be removed by the contractor and given to the homeowner for storage and the replaced at the end of the project
  - Non-standard or decorative mailboxes are the responsibility of the homeowner and must be removed prior to the start of the project
- Irrigation – It is the responsibility of the homeowner to remove any irrigation located in the right-of-way prior to the start of the project
- Landscaping – It is also the responsibility of the homeowner to remove any landscaping they wish to salvage prior to the start of the project
