My Great-Grandfather started to beat my grandfather and his mother at the same time. They couldn't do anything, it fell over. After that my great-grandmother and her kids got divorced and they thought it was over. Goshen continued to not believe our family when they tried to go to the police about the child abuse, they didn't understand how it happened, so just dismissed all the complaints and reports. When my grandfather was 19, he came to my great-grandfather's house and knew that he was bigger and stronger than his father. My grandfather came and decided to fight for his mother's and his own well-being. He beat his father for 20 minutes and then the police arrived and arrested my grandfather immediately. The judge understood why he did it but didn't do anything about his father. My grandfather got charged for one year, but that was all worth it for him. Now, both my grandfather and great-grandmother live their best life that they can.

I know that discrimination of any kind is horrible. If Goshen were to help my family, my grandfather could have been there for his grandmother when she died. Instead, the city dismissed them, and he had to make a decision to fight for what the city didn't. If we worked as a community to make our city more available and outcoming, we would help the stopping of discrimination in Goshen. Fighting in Goshen should be easier, the court should never discriminate and we as a city should show that we aren't our past, we evolved.
